Our annual holiday sale is coming up! For those who are new to this event, it's a chance to let our little darlings shop for their family and enjoy the feeling of giving.

The PAC collects your gently used items in the weeks prior to the sale (donation boxes located at the 3 main entrances of the school) and displays it all in the gym on sale day.

Cash donations are collected by the teacher the morning of. The divisions are called down to the gym, one by one, to "shop". Students are to pick out one item for each member of their family at this time. In keeping with Victoria's environmental initiative, please make sure your child has brought a bag to use to transport their gifts home.

After school, the holiday sale opens up to Vic West Elementary family and friends and the bake sale portion begins!

FAQs

Q?	A!
What becomes of the proceeds of the Holiday and Bake Sale?	This fundraiser is one of our biggest and the PAC uses the money collected during this sale to fund the various other PAC-led activities throughout the year.
What items am I likely to see at the sale?	Every year the donations are a little different so it's hard to say what you'll see. Expect toys and games, primarily, and small pieces of home décor. But you just never know what you'll find. Sadly, you will not be able to build your wardrobe nor furnish your home through this sale as we do not accept clothing or furniture donations for the sale.
Why is there no clothing or furniture donations accepted for the sale?	Clothing donations are usually very hefty sort-throughs, hard to display, and volunteers are already quite busy handling other wares. Furniture is generally too large to store and handle.
How much money does my child need to bring to school to shop at the Holiday Sale?	The students can bring a cash donation the morning of to be collected by their teacher. Having no donation will NOT exclude a student from this sale. After school, items become \$1 each.
How many items is my child allowed to take from the sale?	We would like students to find 1 (one) item per family member, please. During school hours, students will have the opportunity to shop twice, once in the morning (limit of 2 items) and once in the afternoon (no limit). The sale will be open to their families after school, at which point students are able to purchase items at \$1 each.
When is the deadline for item donations?	December 5 th

Am I allowed to shop at the sale?	Yes, after school, the gym opens up to family and friends and the products are sold at \$1/item. All kids should be accompanied by an adult after school. This is also when the Bake Sale portion is added! Baked goods will be priced a little differently, however.
Will there be shopping bags at the Holiday Sale?	No, we're asking that all shoppers bring your own bag.
How late can I shop?	Sale closes at 4:30pm.

ADHD free presentation

On November 22nd, Quadra Elementary School will be hosting an evening presentation for parents and educators called "I Never Knew That About ADHD!". Here is the description of the event:

Child psychologists Dr. Barbara Kennedy and Dr Marei Perrin from Child and Youth Mental Health are sharing their vast knowledge on the topic of ADHD. How is it diagnosed? Will it go away as an adult? Aren't all kids hyperactive? Why would I bother to bring my child in for help? And many more pressing questions. Be prepared to have your preconceptions blown away. This illness is not what most of us think it is!

Following Dr. Kennedy, Rey Marx, London Drugs pharmacist, will ponder the questions surrounding medication use. Is it safe? Will it make my child a zombie? Are there good and bad choices in medications?

Time at the end will be reserved for questions to our presenters. Limited child care spaces will be available in Quadra Elementary School Library. This event runs from 6:00-7:30.
