Our first priority this year is to provide a safe environment for our students, staff and families.

Health and Safety

Schools in British Columbia will be adhering to provincial Health and Safety guidelines and protocols from the BC Centre for Disease Control and WorkSafeBC. Our district has allocated additional custodial time to our school to ensure on-going and deeper cleaning protocols. Outside learning will be encouraged as well as promoting physical distancing as much as possible. Please note, that at this time, only staff and students will be admitted into the building. School Organization

This year we have 275 students registered at Vic West Elementary, with 14 Regular Fulltime Classrooms and 1 Hybrid Classroom. Due to our provincial Health and Safety Cohort Model, class lists are final.

Fulltime In-Class Learning

 Classes will be divided into six cohorts with a maximum of 60 people total, including adults. Any staff member who works within multiple schools or cohorts will be required to wear PPE when working with students. Generally students will be working as a single classroom, however, during recess students will be joining their cohort (another class) of up to 60 individuals total. Each cohort will play in one of three areas of the playground.



The first two days of classes will focus on Health and Safety orientation including: Coughing and Sneezing Etiquette How, When and Why of Proper Hand Washing How, When and Why of Using Hand Sanitizer Assigned Washrooms, Maximum Capacity, and Wait Procedures Proper Use and Storage of Masks if Worn by Students Water Bottles and Water Fountains Entrance and Exit Doors (late morning arrivals) Outside Play Areas and Rotational Schedule Flow of Traffic in Hallways and Classrooms Procedures if Student becomes Sick while at School Address any Signage Posted in Classroom

Hybrid Class

Some families have opted for a Hybrid Learning option. Students will attend 2 full mornings a week and will receive remote learning opportunities on Fridays. In addition to the Hybrid Classroom Teacher, Parents/Caregivers will also be responsible for supporting learning at home approximately two days per week. Students in the Hybrid Model will be starting school the week



of Sept 14 – 18. We will be sending home an email to all families registered in the Hybrid option on Thursday, September 10th. Details regarding which days the student will attend, their first day, drop off and pick up doors, start and end times and what to bring will be shared at that time. The first day of the Hybrid class will focus on Health and Safety orientation.
